Dear DRECP Stakeholders and Covered Species Working Group Members:

As you all know, we provided you and the public the opportunity to comment on an informal document titled "Description and Comparative Evaluation of Draft DRECP Alternatives" which was posted on our web site in December 2012. We also presented an overview of the document during a public WebEx meeting on January 9, 2013(http://drecp.org/meetings/). We appreciate the many helpful comments received on that document, which are posted at http://drecp.org/documents/#eval.

The REAT agencies now are moving forward with preparing the draft DRECP and EIR/EIS which is scheduled for formal public review in late fall of this year. One of the critical components needed to proceed with developing the draft document is a proposed covered species list. The REAT agencies have been working on refining the list based on input received in the past from the Independent Science Advisors in 2010, the Independent Science Panel in 2012, the DRECP Covered Species Working Group and other DRECP Stakeholders, independent experts, public comment on several prior DRECP documents, and agency experts. Based on a complete review of these sources, the REAT agencies have developed the attached table, which includes: 1) a proposed covered species list; 2) species still under consideration for inclusion on the covered species list; and 3) species no longer being considered for inclusion on the covered species list. Also, this list does not address whether, or if, a list of species will be developed for planning purposes, commonly referred to as "Planning Species." The REAT agencies are still evaluating species that may be appropriate for that purpose.

We are not asking for additional comment on these lists at this time. The lists are provided to you now as early information. These lists represent the species that the REAT agencies are, or are not, moving forward with in the development of the draft DRECP. The final list of covered species will be determined after the public review of the draft DRECP and EIR/EIS. As mentioned above, the draft DRECP is scheduled for public review later this year, at which time we will welcome your comments, and will particularly encourage your submittal of any new information that may have become available that may not have been considered by the REAT agencies.
