I have written several reports <sup>1,2</sup> describing my biological surveys of Black Lava Butte and Flat Top Mesa for the federally-listed threatened species of desert tortoise (*Gopherus agassizi*). These reports document the importance of protecting the unique biological diversity of this area. In addition to desert tortoises there are other sensitive, threatened and endangered species present in the area and its zone of influence.

The communities in the Morongo Basin very much appreciate your efforts regarding the BLM's updated West Mojave Plan (WEMO), and the Desert Renewable Energy and Conservation Plan (DRECP). **Please help designate Black Lava Butte and Flat Top Mesa as an Area of Critical Environmental Concern (ACEC).**
